Dear Díary...

The Scenario:

The colony has become more and more populous. However, as more people move into the colony, more land is needed to grow crops. Some colonists want to move outside of the colony's borders onto new land, but that would mean pushing out Native Americans.

Your Task:

Each person in the group will take on one of the following roles, and imagine how that person would have reacted to the scenario:

- 1) A settler who works as a farmer
- 2) A Native American who is being pushed off of land
- 3) The colony's governor who needs to calm the settlers AND the Native Americans
- 4) A settler who believes in pacifism

Each group member will write 1 diary entry from the perspective of 1 of these characters. You must hand in your brainstorming, rough draft, and final draft.

You have two goals for this assignment:

- 1) To demonstrate knowledge of different groups of people from colonial America
- 2) To show that you can take on the perspective of another person
